SAFFRON WALDEN AND VILLAGES TEAM MINISTRY PRAYERS FOR SUNDAYS 11, 18 AND 25 OCTOBER 2020

This prayer sheet is now in a slightly different format, specially designed for those who are praying at home during this time of Coronavirus. It covers three consecutive weeks in October, with readings and suggested hymns for each. Text of the readings will be set out in the Grapevine, which will be sent round each week as usual. We hope that it will continue to connect you to the rhythm of our worship together.

Our readings over these weeks urge us to remain firm in our faith. Sometimes this may involve us in hard choices – but we know that God has chosen each one of us and will give us the strength we need.

You might like to light a candle, symbolising Jesus as the Light of the World: and to say the prayers and readings out loud. Remember that even if you are by yourself at home, you are still part of God's Church, praying across the world.
