As we enter a season of Remembrance, we look back with thanksgiving to God for all whom we have met and loved. Those who's example has enabled us to live lives more closely following the ways of God, as Jesus described in the beatitudes, and those who have shown us that we are loved by God as his children. You might like to light a candle at home while you use this leaflet, symbolising Jesus as the Light of the World: and to say the prayers and readings out loud.

Introduction

As God's people we have gathered, apart from each other, yet joined in love. Let us recognise God's presence with us now, as we worship him, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

We have come together as the family of God in our communities, responding to his call to come and feast with him. Faithful one, whose word is life: come with saving power to free our praise, inspire our prayer and shape our lives for the kingdom of your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

We pray for all who have suffered through the effects of Covid 19, directly by contracting the virus or indirectly through bereavement or by having jobs and livelihoods affected. Help us support and care for one another, particularly those who struggle without the intimate contact of family and friends and who face financial hardship *Lord, in your mercy Hear our prayer*

We pray for your troubled world, remembering those areas that are disrupted by conflict, hardship and social instability. In a moment of silence, offer to God any other needs on your heart.

Merciful Father, accept these prayers, for the sake of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

To crown all things there must be love, to bind all together and complete the whole. Let the peace of Christ rule in our hearts and the peace of the Lord be always with you. **And also with you**.

As you say this, hold in your mind all who are joining in these prayers today.

If you are joining the Eucharist celebrated live via Zoom, do follow the priest saying the Eucharistic prayer, with the standard responses. While only the priest can physically receive the consecrated bread and wine, you are invited to say this prayer of Spiritual Communion, inviting Jesus to enter your deepest being.

My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love you above all things, and I desire to receive you into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as if you were already there and unite myself wholly to you. Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.
