REFLECTIONS

"Then they that feared the Lord spake often to one another; and the Lord harkened, and heard it and a book of remembrance was written before him" Malachi 3.16

On this day we look back on two world wars and other costly conflicts and remember with pride the men and women of the services and the civilians who put duty first, who did not turn aside from sacrifice, who served faithfully and who died serving. With our times now so out of joint as the result of Covi-19 and with so much to make us feel dejected, let us proudly and lovingly lift up our book of remembrance to the Lord. All is not sordid calculation and dissipated selfishness, all is not cruelty and brutality in a world which held such men and women as those who we remember. So our book of remembrance should be kept and should be read for its honoured names.

But if our remembrance today is of men and women, events and wars ONLY, we might better forget, lest we be led to the pride and vengefulness which breed war. If our remembrance is of God, we cannot help but recall that He who revealed God to us asked to be remembered not by victory but by defeat, by broken bread and wine outpoured, and by a cross. It is as we seek to imitate that sacrifice that we shall be closest in spirit to those who have died in war and will do as much as lies in us to ensure that their sacrifice shall not have been in vain.

The community in its need lies about us. It is as we dedicate ourselves afresh to meet those needs that we shall best remember those who sacrificed their lives and shall most faithfully serve him who died that we, and they, might live.

Remembrance Sunday 8th November 2020

Collect

Almighty Father, whose will is to restore all things in your beloved Son, the King of all: govern the hearts and minds of those in authority, and bring the families of the nations, divided and torn apart by the ravages of sin, to be subject to his just and gentle rule; who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

First Reading: 1 Thessalonians 4.13-18

We do not want you to be uninformed, brothers and sisters, about those who have died, so that you may not grieve as others do who have no hope. For since we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have died. For this we declare to you by the word of the Lord, that we who are alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will by no means precede those who have died. For the Lord himself, with a cry of command, with the archangel's call and with the sound of God's trumpet, will descend from heaven, and the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up in the clouds together with them to meet the Lord in the air; and so we will be with the Lord for ever. Therefore encourage one another with these words.

Gospel: Matthew 25.1-13

Jesus spoke this parable to the disciples: 'The kingdom of heaven will be like this. Ten bridesmaids took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish, and five were wise. When the foolish took their lamps, they took no oil with them; but the wise took flasks of oil with their lamps. As the bridegroom was delayed, all of them became drowsy and slept. But at midnight there was a shout, "Look! Here is the bridegroom! Come out to meet him." Then all those bridesmaids got up and trimmed their lamps. The foolish said to the wise, "Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out." But the wise replied, "No! there will not be enough for you and for us; you had better go to the dealers and buy some for yourselves." And while they went to buy it, the bridegroom came, and those who were ready went with him into the wedding banquet; and the door was shut. Later the other bridesmaids came also, saying, "Lord, lord, open to us." But he replied, "Truly I tell you, I do not know you." Keep awake therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour.'

MINISTER'S LETTER

Dear Friends

Our Remembrance Day observance will be different this year. There will be no traditional march past at the Cenotaph, no large gatherings and parades and no military bands. But we will be quiet for two minutes, which is not much time to give for those who gave their whole lives. How shall we fill that time?

For some, two minutes will be too short. Those who served during the Second World War are now a rapidly diminishing band but those still with us will remember their contemporaries and the friends and family who died in war. We will, with them, recall with thanksgiving their courage and their sacrifice.

But most of us are too young to remember the world wars. How can we fill those two minutes? As well as giving thanks for those who gave their lives in the two world wars we can remember those who have fought and died in subsequent conflicts and pray for those who are sad today, for those who were blinded or made invalids by war's cruelty.

All of us can pray for those still in danger in the war zones of the world; for children in many lands who are homeless and hungry because of war. And all of us can pray for peace and dedicate ourselves anew to working for justice for all members of God's family from which alone true peace will come. Then we should listen for God to speak.
