Welcome to the Ninth Newsletter from the Friends.

As you know we have a mission to fulfil the duty that is ours of preserving this Church in all its beauty for those who come after and this year we have continued to do that work.

Our new Friends Notice Board has been busy advertising all the events this last year, with displays and photos changing regularly.

Recent Projects completed

The monthly archive display, using our new display cabinet, goes down really well and has raised a lot of interest.

We purchased a new Advent Candle this year which stood on the repaired (thank you John Mumford) display table and has stubby candles rather than the thin tall ones and it looked splendid throughout Advent (thank you Jane Knight and the team)

Future Projects

It is good news that the PCC has agreed to proceed with the Lighting Project, starting in mid-September when the bats have left the Church. I am delighted that we have been able to donate £60,000. The project has a shortfall of £38,000 at the time of writing (largely due to the curtailment of the VAT rebate) and our donation should help to encourage potential donors and grant givers. The Lighting Project was very dear to Lawrence Gooderham, our previous Chairman.

Noticeboards We have been approached by the Communications Team to refurbish, or where necessary replace, the A-frame and flat notice boards which appear around the Church from time to time. These will in future have a uniform design and some will have a plastic sleeve for advertising a mixture of Church events during the course of the year.

Ongoing Projects

Kneelers. Anyone can commission a kneeler to commemorate a loved one or an occasion and can choose a central design. We charge £40 per kneeler to cover the cost of the canvas and the wool. Work has commenced on a kneeler for the Friends so watch this space!
