

# St Mary's Church, Saffron Walden Children and Youth Leader

Thank you for your interest in the role of Children and Youth Leader at St Mary's Church.

We are looking for someone to lead our team of volunteers working with families in church and school-based activities to help us grow this important ministry.

The focus of the role is to help the wider church family develop the ministry of St Mary's in the 0-11 and 11-18 age group. This will involve both supporting and strengthening existing activities as well as encouraging and leading new initiatives.

You will be joining a team of ordained and lay staff and volunteers who support and collaborate with each other wherever possible as part of the wider team ministry.

We propose that the role should be for 35 hours per week but we are flexible in terms of both experience and working hours. It is more important to us that you have a real heart for working with children, young people and their parents in our church setting to share God's love with them.

#### **About our church**

St Mary's is the Anglican parish church in the historic market town of Saffron Walden in northwest Essex. Committed to the welcome and safeguarding of all, we are a community of all ages and backgrounds who worship God in a wide range of services. Our mission is to share God's love and to invite everyone to follow Jesus Christ with us. Ours is a beautiful church where the Christian faith has been celebrated for over 800 years, and which has a strong musical tradition and a large, robed choir. We are one of the 12 churches within the Saffron Walden and Villages Team Ministry and you will find much more about us on our website www.stmaryssaffronwalden.org

# We hold the following regular activities for pre-school and primary children:

- Sunday Club is held weekly from 10.30-11.30am during term time except for the 4th Sunday when we have an informal Family Service in Church.
- Tinies Baby and Toddler Group meets on Tuesday mornings during term time from 9.30am to 11am in church for craft activity, refreshments and toys. At about 10.30 we have a short service which includes songs, instruments and a Bible story. All parents and carers of babies and pre-school aged children are very welcome to this friendly group.

In addition, we hold ad hoc term-time and holiday activities when our resources permit.

We have close links with St Mary's C.E. Primary School, which is situated in Castle Street, near to the church. Church members participate in the life of the school through assemblies and helping in class, through the governing body and on the staff, and the children are regularly welcomed into church for their special services. We would love to develop our links with the other primary schools and pre-schools in Saffron Walden.

We have a strong junior choir and a lively singing group for children in Years 1-3 which are run under the auspices of our Director of Music as well as affiliated Rainbow, Brownie and Guide groups.

#### We hold the following regular activities for secondary school aged young people:

- Aftershock is for 11-18 year olds and meets on Sundays in the Parish Rooms, from 7.00 to 8.30pm during term time except on the 1st Sunday of each month. It is a chance to socialise, learn and enjoy each other's company and there's normally food involved! Young people from other churches and non-churchgoers are all welcome.
- Once a month, we have **H2H**, a youth led service in the Parish Rooms.
- Youth Bible Study Group meets on Wednesday evenings during term time from 4.30 to 6pm during term time.
- **Sewards End Youth Club** meets monthly on the first Friday of the month, in termtime, 7-8:30pm, for school years 5-7. This is for young people living in Sewards End or the surrounding villages.

In addition, we hold ad hoc term-time and holiday activities when our resources permit.

We have close links with the other churches in the town and often come together for youth activities and residential trips such as DTI (Dreaming the Impossible – a summer gathering of young people for churches and youth organisations everywhere)

We have a strong junior choir and Choral Scholar group which are run under the auspices of our Director of Music as well as an affiliated Guide group.

# Objectives of the role



- To introduce children and young people, aged 0-18, to God's love in Jesus Christ and to nurture them in their faith.
- To encourage and deepen the Christian discipleship of children, young people and their families
- To develop the team of volunteer leaders and helpers and to collaborate with other members of our churches

involved in children and youth work.

• To work with the Ministry Team to develop and implement the strategy for the children and youth work in the Parish as part of the wider team.


# Main duties and responsibilities

- 1. To work closely with the clergy and other staff in the leadership team to provide a welcoming, valued and safe environment to children and families, encouraging them to grow as disciples of Christ.
- 2. To lead the Sunday and weekday programme for children, young people and families at St Mary's and to support the recruitment, encouragement, training and development of the volunteer team working in this programme.
- 3. To lead Sewards End Youth Club with the support of local volunteers.
- 4. To invest in our relationships with local schools, building on existing connections, especially with St Mary's Primary School, including leading occasional assemblies and exploring new initiatives. To support year 6 children at our church and village schools,

for their transition into secondary

school.

- To plan and resource creative programmes that engage and encourage children and young people in their Christian journey
- To encourage and support young people to explore short term and longterm mission opportunities and Christian training.





- 8. To ensure, in conjunction with the Parish Safeguarding Officer and the Rector, that the Parish safeguarding policy and guidelines are fully implemented across all children's activities. To adhere to the Parish health and safety and other policies, including carrying out risk assessments for all activities.
- 9. To organise relevant administration, eg. logistics, rotas, reports, communication with families and budget management.
- 10. To carry out such other duties as the Rector may reasonably require.

#### **Support and supervision**

- 1. You will report to the Chair of the Children and Youth Committee.
- 2. You will attend the weekly team breakfast and briefing from 8.20am-9am on Wednesday mornings whenever possible. This informal meeting helps build relationships in the team, shares good news and ensures that support and advice are readily available.
- 3. You will be a member of the Children and Youth Committee of the Parochial Church Council, meeting roughly 4 times a year, along with other youth and children's leaders in the Parish for mutual support, planning and accountability.
- 4. We encourage you to be an active member of St Mary's Church or to demonstrate an ongoing commitment to worship and prayer in another local church.
- 5. We encourage you to meet regularly with an agreed support group or supervisor.
- 6. We will support you in undertaking appropriate training in children and youth work and safeguarding.
- 7. You will be encouraged to attend the Mustard Seed Team Retreats for Children and Youth Workers three times a year.
- 8. We will support your ongoing professional development through access to relevant courses and conferences to enhance your skills and knowledge.

### Salary and conditions

The full terms and conditions (including working hours, salary and final job description) and will depend on experience. This, together with the start date, will be discussed and agreed with you during the appointment process.

As a guide, we will expect you to work 35 hours each week which will include Sunday mornings and evenings, the Wednesday team breakfast and leading Tinies (currently on Tuesday morning) and the Youth Bible study (currently on Wednesday afternoons). Other hours can be worked flexibly, either in the Parish Office or at home when not attending activities.

Salary is likely to be in the range £ 27,000-£29,000 depending on experience and qualifications. You will be entitled to six weeks holiday pa. to be taken during school holidays unless there are exceptional circumstances. You will normally be expected to be available to take part in Christmas and Easter services and activities.

You may choose to join our occupational pension scheme.

This post requires an enhanced DBS check and you must have a continuing right to work in the UK. You will be required to undertake Church of England Leadership Safeguarding Training.

This post is subject to an occupational requirement that the postholder be a practising Christian under part 1 of Schedule 9 of the Equality Act 2010.

### **Person Specification:**

Essential skills and experience:

- Practising Christian (a reference will be required from your current church leader)
- Good knowledge of the Bible and the ability to share this with children and young people.
- Ability to communicate with children, youth, parents and church workers, including being 'up front'
- Proven ability to engage and enthuse the 0-11 and 11-18 age groups and to disciple children and young people with a wide range of backgrounds and church experience.
- Experience of working with primary and/or secondary school aged children in a paid or voluntary capacity.
- Able to handle, with competence, a demanding and varied workload. Excellent timemanagement and prioritisation skills
- Good personal administration and proficient use of IT
- Good understanding of the need for professionalism in personal conduct. Exercising tact, discretion and confidentiality
- Good understanding of safe practice in a children and youth work environment and sound knowledge of safeguarding requirements

### Desirable skills and experience:

- Advanced level of education e.g. A levels or Level 3 qualifications in appropriate subjects
- Experience of teaching Early Years, KS1, or KS2 children in schools
- Qualification in youth work and/or the willingness to undertake such training alongside this role.
- Awareness of issues relating to young people.
- Experience of working with Pre-schools and/or Primary Schools, including assemblies, with a good understanding of their culture.
- Proven ability to recruit, equip, encourage and lead volunteer teams
- Experience of working collaboratively with other children and youth workers or a ministry team
